- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child who is suffering from shock
- Be able to provide first aid to an infant and a child with a suspected fracture and a dislocation
- Be able to provide first aid to an infant and a child with a head, a neck and a back injury
- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child with conditions affecting the eyes, ears and nose
- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child with a chronic medical condition or sudden illness



- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child who is experiencing the effects of extreme heat and cold
- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child who has sustained an electric shock
- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child with burns or scalds
- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child who has been poisoned
- Know how to provide first aid to an infant and a child who has been bitten

Who is the course intended for?

Pre-course preparation & Prior Course Knowledge

Assessment

This qualification is assessed by practical observation, candidates work books and 20 multiple choice assessment papers. (10 for Unit 1 and 10 for Unit 2)
